



C.1. Geographic Distribution by Country—Figure



C.3. Geographic Distribution by State (Contiguous United States)—Figure







D.1. 5-Yr Enrollment Trends by Level—Chart




D.2. 5-Yr Enrollment Trends—Chart




D.3. 5-Yr Undergraduate Enrollment Trends by Entry Status—Chart





Note: Completions cover the period between July 1 and June 30 of each year.






